Rossano has a definitive signature style. He communicates a unique personal message and perspective in his work. His many years of creativity for well known fashion salons and advertising agencies combined with still life,





The birth of my son in 1999 endowed me with an indescribable sense of worth. He is my first child and his arrival signified a profound change in my perspective on the meaning of life.

On his first day of life in our world I become mesmerized by his tiny fingers as they fl xed and recoiled to the touch of everything new. His fingers were so tiny and I as I held his hand in mine he could just about grip my finge.

As I gazed at this mirecle who was my son with our hands United, an overwhelming bond of love was sealed. I wanted to protect him, to tell him everything, to give him every experience that life could affer. To keep him safe and give him the joy of life.

I wanted to immortalize this precious moment that I knew could never be repeated. So in the only way I knew how, I used my camera to record everything about him. The most significant photograph of that day was indisputably the picture that I made of our hands together. Later after the influence of my friend Arnaldo Pomodoro and, of course, the many other great Italian sculptors, I made this image into a bronze sculpture. It is the one image that is etched into my mind and heart.





I first met with Arnaldo Pomodoro in 1999, I had been working at an exhibition in Prague and published my book 'Betrayed by Light'. I met with Vaclay Havel (when he was serving as the first President of the Czech Republic) for a photoshoot. Then I photographed the ingenious Slovak film director Juraj Jakubisko, followed by the Polish writer and cartoonist Sławomir Mrożek. The English novelist Martin Amis was also within the sights of my lense. Having successfully completed these assignments I was on an all time high. So when I received a call from a mutual friend to make a portrait of one of the greatest Italian artists of our time, Arnaldo Pomodoro, I was instantly elated, then later suffused with a fit of nervous energy at the thought of meeting with the man who, for me, forms the ultimate icon of Italian contemporary art. Arnaldo kindly wrote an introduction to my book Face It and this is what he says.

'Since the very first shot with Rossano Maniscalchi, there was the sense of mutual exchange between the relentless eye of the photographer and the subject itself. Providing me with a feeling of a subtle comprehension, he made me overcome my shyness and embarrassment in front of the camera which made me feel at ease. Even if photography reflects the photographers' personal interpretation and style, Rossano Maniscalchi's results were simply natural.

In his photographs, Maniscalchi pays attention to the faces, gestures, atmospheres, while reflecting his imagination which is set Up in a perfect and original frame. The contrast of light and shadow in his portraits, represents an extraordinary quality of vision and art of expression. Rossano is able to put himself so deeply into a character and focus on details that others may not even be able to perceive: and exactly for this reason the photographs of artists, authors, celebrities from the entertaining business, great personalities become the protagonists of a vision that tells us a story which concerns us all. And all of this is thanks to Mansicalchi giving shape and style by his personal vision..'

Arnaldo Pomodoro



Arnaldo Pomodoro, Sculptor

I first met Michael Cunningham in Florence (2005), then again in Prague and New York. Michael kindly wrote an introduction to my book Without Sound. It is my privilege that he is a firm friend.

We live in an era of specialization. One doctor can attend to our eyes, but we need to find another doctor if we have trouble with our throats. The men who can build the walls of our houses would have no idea how to make a table or chair. Our artists produce abstractions, or installations, or videos. Our photographers are expected to devote themselves exclusively to fashion, or art, or portraiture. Our world, in short, is divided into smaller and smaller segments, even as it grows larger and larger. Which is all the more reason to be grateful for Rossano Maniscalchi. Maniscalchi is that rarest of creatures. a photographer who loves the world in its every aspect, manifestation and condition, without reservations and without categories. He refuses to confine himself. There is, it seems, nothing at all (nothing photographable) that does not fascinate him. He is equally at home, and equally inventive, with portraits, with fashion, with nudes, with still lifes. With whatever it is that catches and returns light. What's truly remarkable about Maniscalchi's work, though, is the way in which it is, on one hand, Uncategorizeable - one could not possibly claim him as an art photographer who also works in fashion, or vice versa but, on the other, imbued with a vision, a technique and an intelligence that's immediately identifiable as his and his alone. His interests are vast, but his pictures are idiosyncratic and personal. He possesses, in abundance, that quality most essential to a true artist; the ability to be true to the world while looking at it in a way that does not exactly resemble that of any other artist, alive or dead. Although it is of course a contradiction in terms, one might think of Maniscalchi as a serene ecstatic. Serene in that he records with laser-like accuracy the ways in which light strikes the curve of a hip, the folds of a curtain, the hollows of a face. Ecstatic in the palpable delight he takes in everything and everyone he sees. The skin of an apple is as potent and magical as the chin of a great writer. An aged hand is as voluptuous and beautiful, in its way, as a woman's breast. In short, Maniscalchi insists on the beauty, the pure wonder, of everything and everyone. He refuses to make distinctions. He tells us, through his photographs, that we live in a remarkable place known as the world and that the world in which we live produces nothing, not one single thing, not one face or flower or grain of sand that is not worthy of praise."

Michael Cunningham

Michael Cunningham, Pulitzer prize for fiction


I first met Robert Mundell in Venice in 2003 at the Summit of the Nobel Prize of Economics. I had been invited along as the official photographer and Robert Mundell was on my list to photograph. I found him to be both fascinating and charming in equal measure. We stayed in touch and in October 2009 he opened my exhibition All or Nothing at the Bohemian National Hall Gallery, New York. Robert also kindly wrote an introduction to my book Without Sound:

'Ansel Adams, the famous photographer known for his wondrous landscapes of the American West, was quoted as saying that 'there are always two people in every picture: the photographer and the viewer.' In the study of photographic portraiture, however one would have to amend his observation to include the subject of the photograph, the sitter. There is a triad.

Unlike looking at a vast Adams Landscape, ethereal and quiet in its static, eternal black and white beauty, a photograph of a human being forces the viewer to enter into the active mind and personality of the subject. In the case of Rossano B. Maniscalchi, his sitters are all well-known by name, immensely creative men and women. To capture their intellectual vibrancy, the 'it' behind the face and demeanor, is no small challenge. His portraits in black and white, offer Us an opportunity to study these faces and to revel in their structural intensity, which is as diverse as the minds they project. The chain, from the photographer to the subject to the camera to the viewer, is thus joined.

No comment on Rossano's work would be complete without mentioning his use of shadow and light. Rossano's lifelong romance with light bears fruit in the most Unexpected ways. He uses light to capture a revealing, sometimes idiosyncratic, moment from the subject and delivers its potency to the viewer, who becomes privy to the new insight. The metamorphosis invokes an energy that produces values going beyond the corporeal subject and illuminates our thinking with dramatic impact."

Robert A Mundell



Robert A Mundell, Nobel Prize Winner in Economic Sciences


In 2001 I was invited by the Director of the International Festival of Poets (Genoa) to take portraits of some of the poets. This is where I first met Jack Hirschman and his Swedish wife (the poet, writer and artist) Agneta Falk. Jack was amazing and kindly wrote an introduction to my book Without Sound.

There are a few moments in the life of the last century, up to the present time, which are of such monumental importance that they demand that arts, in remembering them, resonate with such human grandeur. The human face surpasses itself in those moments and I have always sought to find such glory in portraiture when I look at the immediacy of photographs by artists of the still camera.

Rossano B. Maniscalchi is one such artist who has achieved this. In the portraits he has done, interestingly of two American poets Lawrence Ferlinghetti and Gore Vidal, the monumentality of form and structured resonance a revelatory moment is superbly manifested. Also, in many other portraits in this book of figures, well-known and little-known, who have caught his affectionate eyes, there is that spell of sincerity opening like a lens into more than the merely superficial of facial tone and bodily gesture.

There is then, continuous evocation in these photographs of something grand that has happended in their lives, something more than the simply personal, that has allowed them to be most human at the point of contact with the camera. The grand something may indeed be Rossano's intense and almost acrobatic manner of "catching" a face in its still flight from instant to instant itself.

Jack Hirschman



Jack Hirschman, Poet

Words cannot define our friendship. My memories of Ray remain with me always.

The eye, an extension of the mind. The lens, an extension of the eye. The shutter, an extension of the lens. The shutter, the trigger, an extension of the shutter. The trigger engages. The shutter release is depressed. A click. A whirr. A mechanical function. The shot and the moment captured! An extension of the soul. The soul of the photographer. The unique moment. One time. Never to exist again. Captured by the camera. Preserved.

An ephemeral moment in the fluke. A blink of the eye. A twitch of the finger. The snap of the shutter and a fleeting tick of time is made permanent. The passing parade is stopped for an instant and made immutable. But which instant? The revealing one? The right one? The moment that contains the essence of the subject? The penetrating insight into the heart of the matter? Or, the wrong one. Bad timing. The depression of the shutter release button at the wrong instant. Too early, too hasty. Or, too late, after the fact. The moment not yet matured, or the moment passed.

Rossano has the artist's zen instinct for the right moment. I have walked the street of Genova with him. As his subject and he was always in the moment.

We moved with ease and delight through the twists and turns of that ancient Mediterranean seaport. That city that was old when Christopher Colombo was a youth playing on its cobbled streets. The very same street that Rossano B and I strolled along; shooting, posing, laughing, and being together in an easy symbiosis. Photographer and subject. With no preconceptions, and with no artifice.

We worked the moment. Whatever the energy brought us was right us was right and good; Nothing was foreign to him. Nothing was out of place. Everything was in its proper suchness. Its a zen moment and Rossano was the preserve of the moment.

He kept me, as a great photographer must do, at my ease. We joked about life and its mysteries and absurdities. We talked of current events. We spoke of poetry and music and their interrelationship. Their rhythm and meter. He would snap a shot! In the right instant, always in the right instant. And therein lies the art of photography.

All technical necessities must be absorbed, mastered, and forgotten in an effortless must depression of the plunger, a squeeze of the trigger. Ahh! The finger an extension of the eye. The eye an extension of the brain. The brain an extension of the soul.



Ray Manzarek (The Doors)

The soul an extension of the all-soul in which you and I are one.

Rossano and I were one that early July morning in Genova. So, it seems, were Rossano B and his subjects in this book you hold in your hands. His ease and grace have put his subjects at their ease and allowed their essence to the persons in each photo.

A glimpse, a stopping of time and a soul is captured. We can share that moment with Rossano and the poets. We can be there with them. The intimate moment the two of them shared is ours. We participate in that instant of time preserved by the very

nature of photography. The camera has done its work for Us. It has frozen a butterfly in two dimensions. For our viewing and our delight.

Rossano has done his work for Us. In his alchemical manipulations of the moment - the photographer has done his work for Us and that work is called art.

I first met Achille Bonito Oliva at his home in Rome in 2000 Larrived with my beautiful wife and as he opened the door he looked at us and said "you have come to photograph me, just give me 5 minutes...". We entered the house and patiently waited. He returned to the room completely naked! Somewhat surprised, I said "are you excited about me or my beautiful wife?" to which he replied "all photographers photograph me naked". I said "no, please, really no!" Looking rather disappointed, he disappeared again to put his clothes back on. Achille made only one request of importance to him, that no other art critic could appear in the same book as his portrait. Apparently he usually charged a fee of several thousand Euros to take his picture, but he made no charge to me and even kindly wrote an introduction to my book Without Sound:

'God can see you and so can Rossano B. Maniscalchi. A special correspondent, in the !eld of reality, the implicative photographic eye, documenting the private that likes to become public. He always comes with the self-discipline of the old family doctor to places where intimacy is about to become part of the social scene. With his pictures he documents such events of fabulous revelation with impartial cannibalism.

The myth is not the result of a naive way of thinking; it is the collective imagination the photographer manages to fashion into iconography appealing to all tastes and palates, the sophisticated and the infantile. In a way Maniscalchi reveals the typical social attributes of a mass civilization that demands that the famous bear unremitting responsibility for the way they look, the look upon which the lens of the camera is focused permanently, knowing no breaks. no respite, no absolution. From the intellectual drabness of the seventies. through the rampant hedonism of the eighties, right Up to the protagonism of the nineties, the photographer has systematically documented all these changes through a «system of stars» in culture, politics, and haute couture, always with dexterity and with a sense of irony, expressing the passion that is released in the aloofness of the camera. Detachment and participation, neutrality and curiosity, these become the polarities of the social explorer in the service of a profession that is never antagonistic, but privy.Maniscalchi the entomologist has gathered a collection of portraits that retain the aloofness existing between the well known and their adulating public. It is a visual gesture that, humanly, puts heroes into a social body."
